






## **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS**

The academic achievements of Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur, in the last academic year reflect the university's strong commitment to excellence in higher education and research. Guided by the principles of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the University has made significant changes in curriculum design, teaching methods, and academic governance to ensure quality, relevance, and inclusivity across all programs.

- CSJM University made its appearance in the prestigious QS Asia University Rankings for the first time in November 2024. CSJM University was ranked in the band of 801 to 850 in Asia and 263rd in South Asia.
- CSJM University has also found a place in the QS Sustainability 2025 rankings. It is ranked 1501+ in the QS Sustainability Rankings 2025
- The University presently offers 144 academic programmes, comprising 53 undergraduate, 64 postgraduate, 11 Diploma, 4 PG Diploma, 3 Integrated, and 9 certificate programmes. PhD programme is offered in 54 subjects at the University.


- As of the present, a total of 5,04,531 Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) IDs have been created at CSJM University. These unique identifiers will enable students to digitally store, transfer and redeem the academic credits earned across different institutions.
- New programmes: The University successfully launched 17 new academic programmes this year – 3 undergraduate, 8 postgraduate, 1 PG Diploma, and 5 certificate courses. Increase in Student Strength – The University has witnessed a remarkable and consistent rise in student enrolment over the past five years. This sustained upward trajectory is a testimony to the growing academic reputation and credibility, availability of relevant and innovative programmes, expanding infrastructure, strengthened research activities, and progressive initiatives undertaken by the University.



- Introduction of Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) The University has introduced the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) in alignment with NEP 2020 and in accordance with the regulations of the UGC and the Government of Uttar Pradesh. This reform aligns the University's undergraduate education with the new 5+3+3+4 structure proposed under NEP 2020 and brings it at par with global higher education frameworks. The programme incorporates multiple entry and exit options, multidisciplinary electives, value-added and skill-based courses, as well as co-curricular components, with a strong emphasis on research and project work in the fourth year. The revised FYUP-based curriculum has been adopted in over 33 subjects from the academic session 2025–26.
- Implementation of SWAYAM courses CSJMU has effectively implemented MOOC-based learning by encouraging students to enrol in courses offered through the SWAYAM platform. In the January 2025 session, students from the campus and affiliated colleges undertook 107 SWAYAM courses. The total registrations on SWAYAM portal reached 9,448 in this session, making it the highest among the multidisciplinary state government universities in Uttar Pradesh. As of now, the University has recorded a total enrolment of 15,487 on the SWAYAM platform in 2025.
- Vocational courses in emerging areas The University has introduced vocational courses in emerging areas such as AI for AII, Cybersecurity, AI for Arts, Commerce and Science, AI-Powered Creative Writing, and Financial Literacy for AII to equip students with practical skills that complement their academic learning. These courses have been designed in collaboration with Institutes of National repute, such as IIT Kanpur, and other industry experts such as MaxPro AI and Kalam SPS Research Centre Pvt. Ltd.
- Implementation of AEDP Programmes Four Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programmes (AEDP) with structured industry internships integrated in the undergraduate curriculum are being conducted in the affiliated colleges of CSJM University. These programmes, namely BBA Retail, BBA Logistics, BBA Event Management, and B.Com. E-Commerce aligns with the NEP 2020 vision of outcome-based, skill-driven education.
- International Students and Collaborations CSJMU has undertaken several proactive steps to strengthen its international outreach. 19 international MOUs have been signed with reputed universities of USA, Taiwan, Malaysia, Kazakhstan, Nepal for academic collaboration and joint research. The University has welcomed over 35 students from countries including Nepal, Bangladesh, Saudi Arabia, Nigeria, and Namibia, reflecting its growing international appeal. The University has also successfully organized the Global Business Summit on 12<sup>th</sup> August 2025 and Cultural Exchange Immersion Programmes, fostering cross-cultural learning and international partnerships. The University has initiated and finalized the framework for recruiting international faculty members, and the recruitment process is currently underway.
- Student Success in GATE/JAM/NET-JRF During the academic session 2024—25, the students of CSJM University showcased commendable performance in various national-level competitive examinations. A total of 51 students qualified the GATE examination, 52 students cleared UGC-NET/CSIR-NET, 7 students qualified GPAT, while 14 students cleared IIT JAM, securing opportunities in prestigious institutes. The University also takes pride in 7 students qualifying AIIMS examinations and 6 students excelling in GST-B.

- Dronacharya Centre for Online Education The University received approval from the UGC's Distance Learning Bureau to offer 4 online and 11 distance education programmes. The first batch of students was admitted in October 2024, and currently, more than 200 students are enrolled across various programmes in the online and distance learning mode.
- Minor Degree Programme in Engineering CSJMU has launched Minor Degree programmes in Engineering under NEP-2020 and AICTE guidelines, enabling students to gain multidisciplinary expertise. This initiative broadens academic exposure while enhancing employability and industry readiness.

- Implementation of the Young Teachers Scheme To enhance the quality of education and align the student—teacher ratio with the requirements of national ranking agencies, the University has introduced the Young Teachers Scheme. The scheme offers a three-year tenure, with eligibility criteria as per UGC/AICTE norms, and an upper age limit of 35 years (relaxable up to 40 years for SC/ST/OBC candidates). Under this initiative, more than 80 teachers have already been recruited on the University campus.
- Recruitment of Professors of Practice The University has appointed 38 distinguished professionals from industry, research, and other fields as Professors of Practice in different departments of the university campus to bridge the gap between academic learning and real-world applications. These appointments will strengthen experiential learning and enhance the employability of graduates.
- Faculty Training and Capacity Building Programmes The University has undertaken multiple initiatives to bolster the digital capabilities and pedagogical proficiency of its faculty.
- 1) The Department of Computer Applications, UIET, organized hands-on training sessions on MOODLE LMS to equip faculty with skills for integrating technology into teaching—learning and evaluation processes during 17<sup>th</sup> -18<sup>th</sup> Feb and 21<sup>st</sup> Feb 2025.

- 2) A 10-day Faculty Development Programme titled "Introduction to AI Agents" was conducted in partnership with Giganati AI Academy, covering advanced topics like prompt engineering, multi-agent workflows, API integration, and emerging technologies. 207 faculty members were trained during this FDP.
- 3) A 6-day FDP on Indian Knowledge Traditions for disciplines of Science and Technology was conducted between 22.10.24 and 27.10.24 in collaboration with IKS division of AICTE, Siksa (IKS Centre of IIT Kanpur), and Braht Educational Organization. 57 faculty members were a part of this FDP.
- Digital Initiatives: CSJMU actively promotes digital initiatives to strengthen teaching, learning, and administration.
- 1) Adoption of Samarth Portal for complete digital governance in admissions, academics, examinations, and administration.
- 2) Implementation of MOOCs (SWAYAM/NPTEL) with over 9,000 student registrations in a single session the highest among UP state universities.
- 3) Moodle Learning Management System (LMS) Platform on SAMARTH portal used to share e-content, conduct quizzes, and Mid-semester examinations using Safe Browser mode and digital question papers.
- 4) Faculty Development Programmes on AI, digital pedagogy, and emerging technologies to enhance teaching skills.
- 5) Smart classrooms and digital labs established across departments to promote ICT-enabled learning.
- 6) Online and Distance Learning (ODL) programmes approved by UGC, with over 200 students already enrolled.
- 7) E-office, online digital payments and paperless administration initiatives to streamline processes and reduce manual workload.
- Establishment of Supercomputing Hub for Artificial Intelligence-Based Learning: CSJMU has established a state-of-the-art Supercomputing Hub for Artificial Intelligence-Based Learning under the PM-USHA scheme with a grant of ₹7.5 crores. Equipped with advanced high-performance computing infrastructure, this facility is among the few of its kind in Indian universities. It is designed as a shared resource for researchers across disciplines, enabling cutting-edge work in areas such as genome sequencing, drug discovery, Al-driven medical imaging, and financial forecasting. Alongside research, workshops and training sessions are being organized to build student and faculty capacity, aligning with the vision of NEP-2020.



• Harish Chandra Research Centre: The Centre inaugurated at the School of Basic Sciences on 18th October 2024 aims to promote advanced research in mathematics and theoretical physics. The Centre would serve as a premier center for fundamental research in areas like algebra, number theory, string theory, quantum field theory, and cosmology. A series of lectures by eminent academicians titled Harish Chandra Lecture Series in regularly conducted by the students of Physics and Mathematics.



• AICTE IDEA Lab: The AICTE IDEA (Idea Development, Evaluation & Application) Lab has been sanctioned at CSJM University on 10th February 2025 with a project cost of ₹90 lakhs. Envisioned as a hub of innovation, the lab will promote hands-on learning in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM), enabling students to translate ideas into realworld solutions. Located in the Central Workshop Building, it will serve not only university students but also nearby schools and institutes, fostering regional innovation and collaboration.



# RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT



## **RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT**

The Research and Development Cell of the University has undertaken key initiatives to strengthen research, foster analytical thinking among scholars, and generate outcomes that benefit both academia and society.

The University has strengthened its research ecosystem by establishing new facilities and developing well-equipped laboratories with advanced instruments. The faculty and research scholars from the campus and affiliated colleges received special support, including financial assistance and recognition for outstanding contributions.


Some key highlights include:

- Successful release of Research Doctoral Committee (RDC) letters for Ph.D. programmes (2023–24) and Research Advisory Committee (RAC) letters for earlier sessions (2019–20, 2021–22, 2022–23).
- Allotment of research supervisors for the 2024–25 session, with new supervisors appointed in 22 subjects across sciences, engineering, social sciences, humanities, law, and commerce.
- Announcement of 744 Ph.D. seats in 51 subjects for the academic year 2025–26.
- Award of doctoral degrees to 75 research scholars in 22 subjects, including an international scholar in Microbiology. Ms. Mumtaz Bano Miya from Nepal has completed her doctoral thesis under Dr. Anuradha Kalani from the School of Life Sciences and Biotechnology.
- Introduction of industry-sponsored Ph.D. admissions from 2025–26 to strengthen academia—industry linkages.
- Organization of ten international conferences and publication of over 195 research papers in indexed journals and proceedings.
- Conduct of a workshop on Open Access Publication on June 9, 2025, by the Research and Development Cell and Central Library.

## **GROWTH IN RESEARCH SCHOLARS**


 This year witnessed an encouraging rise in research enrolments at CSJMU, with over 400 new Ph.D. scholars joining the University. Nearly 100 of them are pursuing their

work on campus, creating a dynamic and collaborative research ecosystem. With 52 JRF/SRF fellows and multiple international conferences hosted this year, the University continues to nurture young researchers and foster global collaborations. The surge in research scholar intake directly fuels the increase in publications and patent filings.




## **PUBLICATIONS ON THE RISE**

Our research output on campus has grown at an unprecedented pace. From just 38 publications in 2021, the number rose to 65 in 2022, 78 in 2023, and 102 in 2024, culminating in a record 135 publications in 2025—a remarkable 255% growth in four years. These publications in internationally indexed journals reflect the dedication and scholarly excellence of our faculty and students.




Equally significant is the wide range of subjects in which our faculty and scholars are making contributions. Medicine forms the largest share with 11.8% of publications, closely followed by engineering at 11.7%, and biochemistry, genetics, and molecular biology accounting for 11.6%. Agricultural and biological sciences contribute 9.3%, and

computer science 8.2%., while environmental science contributes 6.4%. What is also striking is that about 25.3% of the publications fall into other disciplines, spanning the social sciences, humanities, and education, affirming the University's truly multi disciplinary character.




## DEEPENING RESEARCH IMPACT THROUGH HIGHER CITATIONS AND H-INDEX

The University's h-index has increased from 20 to 28, reflecting deeper global impact and recognition of the work of the faculty and scholars. Citations surged from 118 in 2022 to 438 in 2023, and a record 948 citations were achieved in 2024. In the ongoing year 2025, with several months remaining, the citation count has already surpassed 800. Between 2021 and 2025, the university community has collectively produced 279 research papers, which have already attracted more than 3000 citations.



## **EXPANDING ACCESS THROUGH ONE NATION ONE SUBSCRIPTION (ONOS)**

Our participation in the government's flagship One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) initiative has transformed access to knowledge for the entire CSJMU community. Faculty, researchers, and students now enjoy universal access to a vast digital library of leading journals, books, and databases, removing traditional barriers of high subscription costs. ONOS has ensured equitable access to knowledge, empowering all scholars to engage in world-class research.

## **PROJECTS & RESOURCE GENERATION**

The University has taken remarkable strides in advancing research and innovation through externally funded projects. Supported by national and state-level agencies such as ANRF, DST, DBT, UPCST, UP-COE, and UP-R&D, the projects not only reflect the scholarly strength of our faculty but also showcase their ability to address pressing societal and industrial challenges.

## **NATIONAL RECOGNITION:**

ANRF—PAIR Grant - This year marked a historic milestone for CSJMU with the university securing the prestigious ANRF—PAIR Category B Grant in collaboration with IIT Kanpur. The project focuses on pioneering cancer research using exosome biology and advanced biosensing technologies. By integrating life sciences with semiconductor engineering, the initiative aims to create innovative diagnostic



platforms for early detection and monitoring of cancer biomarkers. Led by Dr. Anuradha Kalani with a stellar multi-disciplinary team from the School of Life Sciences and Biotechnology (Dr. Shilpa D. Kaistha, Dr Rajeev Mishra, Dr Chandresh Sharma) and School of Engineering and Technology (Dr Vishal Awasthi and Dr Ajeet Kumar Srivastava), this award positions CSJMU among India's select institutions driving interdisciplinary, high-impact research with real-world applications.

## RESEARCH GRANTS SECURED IN 2024-25

- During the year 2024–25, the University obtained seven research projects under the Uttar Pradesh R&D Scheme, with a total sanctioned amount of Rs. 23.43 lakhs. In addition, two research grants amounting to Rs. 33.72 lakhs were awarded under the UP-CST Scheme.
- Dr. Dipesh Verma has been awarded the Prime Minister Early Career Research Grant (ANRF-ECRG) of Rs. 60 lakhs. for his study on photoreceptor biology and retinitis pigmentosa.
- Two other projects one from ICSSR (Dr. Ankit Trivedi) and one from DBT Programme for Societal Development (Dr. Rajeev Mishra) were received

- One project from AIU, with a grant of Rs.2 lakh, focusing on the multidisciplinary implications of Artificial Intelligence in higher education, was received by Dr. Anshu Singh.
- One project from C3i Hub, with a grant of ₹10 lakh, focusing on the design and analysis of multivariate digital signature schemes as post-quantum candidates aligned with NIST standards, was received by Dr. Namita Tiwari.


## **ONGOING RESEARCH GRANTS FROM NATIONAL AGENCIES**

CSJMU researchers are actively engaged in projects supported by DST, DBT, UPCST, SERB, and State University Research Excellence (SURE) Schemes.


- DST-FIST has provided ₹1.75 crore for setting up the Har Gobind Khurana Centre for Life Science Research to support research in biomaterials, nanotechnology, and life sciences.
- State University Research Scheme (SURE) DST-SERB has sanctioned a project of Rs. 28.92 lakhs for three years (2024-2027). This project will strengthen translational research on antimicrobial resistance and provide advanced training opportunities in immunology and therapeutic development at CSJMU.
- Dr. Pramod Yadav has been awarded the prestigious DBT Ramalingaswami Re-entry Fellowship, with a total grant of ₹1,13,60,000 for the period 2020–2025.
- An ongoing project (2023–2026) led by Dr. Akhilendra Pratap Bharti, focusing on the understanding of motor protein dynamics, has been sanctioned by DST-SERB, Government of India, with a total grant of ₹49,17,070.
- An ongoing project (2023–2025) led by Dr. Anshu Singh, focusing on developing a web-based machine learning pipeline to document and disseminate tribal cultural and traditional aspects in India, has been sanctioned by ICSSR, Government of India, with a total grant of ₹7,50,000.
- Dr. Rachapudi Venkata Sreeharsha is currently leading an ongoing project (2022–2027) under the DST-INSPIRE Faculty Fellowship with a grant of ₹37,74,755,
- Additionally, two faculty members generated external resources, with Prof. Varsha Gupta securing approximately ₹1.5 lakh for the purchase of a laptop, and Dr. Rajeev Mishra obtaining ₹90,000.

## STATE-SUPPORTED AND UNIVERSITY-SUPPORTED RESEARCH GRANTS


Under the U.P. CoE scheme, CSJMU secured funding worth over Rs. 89.55 lakhs in 2022–23 and Rs. 27.45 lakhs in 2024–25. These grants are directed towards supporting 21 projects in 2022–23 and 6 projects in 2024–25.



- With 16 projects sanctioned between 2022-25 and a total funding of Rs. 41, 07, 600, the UP R&D Scheme supports innovative work in applied sciences, environmental sustainability, and materials research.
- The C.V. Raman Research Grant is the University's in-house research



support program that provides faculty with initial funding to pursue high-quality research and build a stronger research ecosystem within the University. 109 projects were sanctioned for faculty members of the University campus and affiliated colleges



with a total amount of Rs. 79, 35, 000 between 2022 to 2024. The distribution of grants are as follows - 45 grants (Rs. 35,65,000) in 2022, 38 grants, (Rs. 23,15,000) in 2023 and and 26 grants (Rs. 20,55,000) in 2024.

 Launch of New C.V. Raman Research Grants (August 14, 2025): To strengthen

research, foster interdisciplinary collaboration, and drive innovation toward translational, product-oriented outcomes, CSJMU has restructured its traditional C.V.

Raman scheme. The revamped program now offers substantial support through Minor Grants (up to ₹2 lakh) and Major Grants (up to ₹5 lakh), empowering faculty to undertake highimpact, cutting-edge research projects and build state-of-the-art laboratories, ultimately positioning the university as a hub of innovation and knowledge creation.

## INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES

The University continued its legacy of academic excellence and global engagement in 2024–25 by hosting a series of major international conferences across diverse disciplines. These events collectively positioned the university as a hub for interdisciplinary scholarship, knowledge exchange, and global collaboration.

With participation from over 3,000 delegates, including researchers, students, industry experts, and policymakers from more than 20 countries, the conferences not only showcased CSJMU's academic strengths but also created tangible outcomes in terms of publications, collaborations, and policy-relevant insights.

## CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS:

• International Symposium on Frontiers of Research in Speech and Music (FRSM–2024) | 15–16 Nov 2024 The 28th International Symposium on Frontiers of Research in Speech and Music (FRSM-2024) was organized by the University Institute of Engineering and Technology, CSJM University, Kanpur, in collaboration with the Sir C.V. Raman Centre for Physics and Music, Jadavpur University, on 15–16 November 2024. The focal theme of the symposium was "Speech, Music and its Applications in Everyday Life". The event brought together researchers, academicians, and professionals to present and discuss their work in four major tracks—Speech & Hearing, Music (Vocal & Instrumental), Languages & Linguistics, and

Interdisciplinary Applications—through around ten technical sessions conducted over two days. Continuing the rich legacy of FRSM, which has been hosted annually across various cities in India since 1990, the symposium provided a vibrant platform for interdisciplinary exchange. Selected and peer-reviewed papers from FRSM-2024 are published in an edited volume by Springer, showcasing



contemporary research in speech, language, and music technology.

• 2. International Conference on Advances in Life Sciences (ICALS–2025) | 9–11 Jan 2025 Organized by the School of Life Sciences & Biotechnology, ICALS brought together ~150 participants and featured 74 presentations. Themes included cancer biology, plant sciences, biomedical sciences, and renewable energy. With 25–30 papers accepted in a Scopus-indexed journal, the event fostered strong visibility in life sciences research.







• Global Issues in Multidisciplinary Research for a Digital Future (FAI–ICGIMRDF 2025) | 16–17 Feb 2025 Jointly organized with FATER Academy of India and School of Basic Sciences, this hybrid event featured leading experts from Romania, Ukraine, Thailand, and India. Discussions ranged from mathematics and computer science to finance, risk management, and sustainability. The symposium underscored interdisciplinary solutions for digital transformation and ESG frameworks.





### HealthCon 2025 | 1–2 Mar 2025

Hosted by the School of Health Sciences, HealthCon attracted 700+ delegates with 156 research presentations. Highlights included AI in healthcare, neuroplasticity, myopia research, and diagnostic innovations. The HealthTech Innovation Challenge inspired young innovators, while MoUs with indexed journals ensured international research visibility.



Pharmaceutical Frontiers: Exploring Future Trends and Technologies (PFEFT-2025) | 8
 Mar 2025 The School of Pharmaceutical Sciences convened 320 delegates to deliberate
 on drug discovery, personalized medicine, AI in drug design, and herbal innovations.
 Eminent speakers from India and abroad delivered keynotes, and 15 papers were
 selected for publication. The event reinforced CSJMU's role in pharmaceutical
 innovation for healthcare.



## • Entrepreneurship & Innovation: Navigating Global Challenges | 24–25 Mar 2025

Organized by the School of Business Management in collaboration with Astana International University (Kazakhstan), the event saw 280+ participants and 122 papers. Themes included AI-driven business, sustainable models, and social entrepreneurship. Collaborations were strengthened with institutions from the USA, Spain, Croatia, and Sri Lanka.



• International Conference on Recent Advances in Emerging Computing & Communication Technologies (ICRAECCT-2025) | 11–12 Apr 2025 The School of Engineering & Technology hosted CSJMU's first major international computing conference, with 350 submissions, 200 acceptances, and 115 presentations. With keynote speakers from USA, Russia, Portugal, Germany, and South Korea, the conference achieved major scholarly impact, with publications accepted in Scopus-indexed edited volumes (Wiley, IGI Global, World Scientific).



• International Conference on Sustainable Energy and Advance Materials | 18-19 Apr 2025 Jointly organized by the Departments of Chemical, Mechanical, Material Science & Metallurgical Engineering, and Vocational Studies, School of Engineering & Technology, the two-day conference brought together experts and researchers to discuss innovations in sustainable energy and advanced materials. Eminent keynote speakers delivered lectures on green hydrogen, electrochemical methods, and heavy metal removal. A total of 80 research papers were presented across eight technical sessions with participants from India, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Sri Lanka, and the USA.



• International Conference on Multidisciplinary Approach to Sustainability: A Holistic View Towards the Future | 29 Apr 2025 Jointly organized by the Schools of Arts, Humanities & Social Sciences and Teacher Education, this one-day event attracted 300+ delegates and 150 papers. Themes included sustainable economics, education for global citizenship, climate change, and indigenous knowledge. Experts from five global universities shared insights on clean energy, ecological modeling, and AI in sustainability.



• International Conference on Law, Technology & Society: Emerging Issues and Interdisciplinary Perspectives | 22–23 Aug 2025 Hosted by the Atal Bihari Vajpayee School of Legal Studies, this two-day conference addressed cybersecurity, data protection, AI in law, and digital governance. With 128 papers, and sessions led by leading jurists, the event highlighted the ethical and legal dilemmas of technology. Selected papers will be published in Scopus/Web of Science journals.

The IRAC Cell, established in February 2023, is the University's nodal agency for internationalization. Its primary objectives include:

- Building academic partnerships with foreign institutions.
- Facilitating student and faculty exchange programs.
- Coordinating joint research, publications, and conferences.
- Promoting dual degree and credit transfer programs.

## During the reporting period, the IRAC Cell recorded significant progress in internationalization:

- Over 20 new Memorandam of Understanding (MoUs) were initiated with esteemed institutions in Russia, Kazakhstan, Nepal, Kazakhstan, and the USA, reflecting an expanding global footprint. All MoUs indicated are currently active.
- The University experienced a notable jump in international student enrollments from countries including Russia, Brazil, Nepal, Bangladesh, Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, and others.
   This surge underscores CSJM University's increasing appeal and reputation among global students.
- Close to 40 admissions of foreign students have been done so far to the various programs in this session. More than 500 applications have been received from around a dozen countries across the world. Amongst other programs, Hindu Studies is also emerging as one of the popular programs of our university among the prospective students especially from Europe, Africa, etc.
- Several visits and delegations were facilitated during this period, including Higher Education Summits and academic exchanges with universities in the UK, Taiwan, Vietnam, Nepal, Kazakhstan, and more. These collaborations focused on joint research, innovation, and the exchange of best practices in higher education.

## **INNOVATION CELL ACTIVITIES**

## MoU with IIT Kanpur (2 November 2024)

On IIT Kanpur's 65th Foundation Day, CSJMU signed an MoU with IIT Kanpur in the presence of Hon'ble Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh. The agreement strengthens collaboration in innovation, incubation, and infrastructure. Senior officials and the CSJM Innovation Foundation team represented the University on this landmark occasion.



• Industry-Academia Meet "Udbhav 2024" (12 November 2024) The University organized Udbhav 2024 to bridge gaps between academia, industry, R&D institutions, and society. The meet created a collaborative platform for fostering research, innovation, and entrepreneurship. The initiative reflected CSJMU's long-term vision of building an innovation-driven ecosystem.



## • Workshop on Artificial Intelligence (10–11 December 2024)

A two-day workshop on AI explored its applications in education, healthcare, and daily life. Expert sessions and demonstrations were conducted by academics and industry trainers, offering hands-on learning for students and faculty. The program equipped participants with insights into emerging AI-driven transformations.



• **Udyamotsav 2025** – **National Entrepreneurship Day (16 January 2025)** CSJMU celebrated Udyamotsav 2025 in collaboration with AICTE and the Ministry of Education. The event brought together entrepreneurs, investors, and innovators, inspiring students toward entrepreneurship. Distinguished industry leaders and angel investors shared insights on startup growth and investment readiness.



• Abhivyakti '25 Startup Program (17–19 January 2025) In partnership with IIT Kanpur, a three-day startup conclave showcased innovations from across India. CSJMU-incubated startups, including Autoclik and HealthCompass, presented their ventures to investors and mentors. Several startups received funding, highlighting the University's growing entrepreneurial footprint.



## National Conference on AI for Sustainable Cities (3–4 February 2025)

The conference gathered 25 Vice-Chancellors, 35 academic leaders, and 35 startups to deliberate on Al-driven urban solutions. Eminent speakers from IIT Kanpur, IIT Roorkee, NITI Aayog, and industry discussed sustainability, ESG integration, and Al-led governance. The event positioned CSJMU at the forefront of Al-policy dialogue.



• Robo Rumble 2.0 (17–18 February 2025) A two-day robotics competition engaged school and university teams in Robo War and Robo Soccer. Sponsored by industry partners, the event showcased student talent in automation and design. Winners included teams from CSJMU, HBTU, and DPS Azad Nagar.



• Launch of Nutrition Counselling Centre (15 April 2025) CSJMU incubatee Shishya Soft Tech launched a Nutrition Counselling Centre at Upper India Sagar Hospital, Kanpur. The center offers free maternal and child health services through digital records and Al-driven tracking. The initiative reflects CSJMU's commitment to health-tech innovation.



## Launch of Ayurvedic Brand "Anarna" (17 May 2025)

Incubatee ChartSeas Exports LLP launched Anarna, a range of Ayurvedic cosmetics, at CSJMU. Products such as herbal face wash, oils, and conditioners were introduced with plans for statewide distribution. The brand emphasizes natural wellness and sustainable beauty solutions.

## • Student Entrepreneurship Bootcamp (26–31 May 2025)

In collaboration with T-Hub, CSJMU hosted a week-long training bootcamp. Students engaged in workshops, mentoring, and startup simulations, with 38 teams presenting ideas. Eleven teams were selected for the prestigious Blitz Program at T-Hub Hyderabad.



- Incubation & Acceleration Program (22 July 2025) A joint program with SIIC IIT Kanpur trained students and faculty in AI and ML applications for startups. Sessions highlighted real-world use cases, startup success stories, and entrepreneurial pathways. The event strengthened AI-driven incubation support at CSJMU.
- Cybersecurity MoU with IIT Kanpur (4 August 2025) CSJMU signed a tripartite MoU with IIT Kanpur and C3iHub to launch an online Cybersecurity course in Hindi. Covering cybercrime, data safety, dark web threats, and online security, the course features hands-on labs and internships. It aligns with Skill India and Digital India missions.

## INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS (IPR) CELL

The Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell of the University was established in 2024. The Cell marked a transformative step towards strengthening the culture of innovation and protecting the intellectual contributions of faculty members, researchers, and students. Its mission extends beyond legal safeguards—it seeks to cultivate an environment where original ideas are nurtured, protected, and translated into societal and industrial impact.

## **AWARENESS AND OUTREACH INITIATIVES**

• The IPR Cell has successfully organized more than 12 workshops, conducting these programs every month to benefit students, research scholars, and faculty members. For these sessions, the IPR Cell has



invited eminent experts from JT Attorney Alliance, including Mr. Jignesh Mungalpara and Mr. Tushar Kumar Srivastava, who have guided participants on the process of patent filing, trademark registration, and other critical aspects of IPR.

- Specialized workshops, such as the one conducted in the Fine Arts Department on 24th August 2024 and 21st September 2024, demonstrated how creative works like original designs can also be registered and protected. Such targeted initiatives have broadened the scope of IPR awareness beyond traditional science and technology disciplines, reaching into the fields of art, design, and humanities.
- The IPR Cell organized an Ideathon on 26th April 2025 to celebrate World Intellectual Property Day. The event attracted enthusiastic participation from students and faculty members across CSJMU and affiliated colleges. Participants showcased innovative ideas before an expert jury, with awards recognizing the most promising contributions. Complementing this, a Faculty Development Program (FDP) was held to train faculty from affiliated colleges, empowering them to mentor students and foster a culture of innovation-driven learning.

## **GROWTH IN PATENT FILINGS**

One of the most visible impacts of the IPR Cell has been the dramatic rise in patent and design filings. From its establishment in 2024 until the end of that year, the University filed 258 patents and six design applications across a wide range of disciplines. The School of Engineering and Technology emerged as the top contributor, followed by Health Sciences, Life Sciences, Hotel Management, and Pharmaceutical Sciences.

A landmark moment came on World Intellectual Property Day, 26 April 2025, when the University facilitated the filing of 101 patents and 59 design applications by assistant professors, research scholars, and students. This collective achievement highlighted the growing enthusiasm within the academic community and positioned the university as a leading center of IPR activity at the regional and national level.

- Next-Gen Aluminum Alloy for Aerospace and EV Markets A specially designed aluminum-magnesium-lithium alloy with superior strength-to-weight ratio, corrosion resistance, and durability, targeting applications in aerospace, automotive, and electric vehicle industries.

## **CENTRAL LIBRARY**

The Central Library of the University has undergone significant modernization during 2024–25, establishing itself as a smart, inclusive, and research-supportive knowledge center.

## DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION-LIBRARY ON DEVICE

A landmark initiative, the e-library "Library on Device", has been developed to provide seamless access to study and research materials from anywhere, anytime via a single window and search engine. Accessible via mobile application, the platform houses over 1 million e-resources, including 6,236 journals, 36,569 e-books, 135,654 video lectures, 640,057 research works, 10,211 university theses, 136,461 expert talks, and 49,160 general reading materials, with resources also available in Hindi. Online databases from leading publishers (Elsevier, Springer, Taylor & Francis, Wiley, and Sage) further enrich the repository.

## ORIENTATION, RESEARCH SUPPORT, AND ANTI-PLAGIARISM MEASURES

Orientation programs across departments have promoted the use of e-library resources, significantly increasing engagement. All research materials have been digitized and uploaded on the e-library and Shodhganga Repository, supported by advanced plagiarism detection tools for both local and foreign languages. This has greatly enhanced the quality, credibility, and originality of research outputs.

## RFID-BASED SMART SERVICES


The library has fully implemented RFID technology, enabling self-service book issue and return through touchscreen kiosks, automated alarm-equipped security gates, and smart card—based membership. This system has improved operational efficiency, error-free storage, and real-time tracking, while reducing staff workload.

## PHYSICAL AND INCLUSIVE IMPROVEMENTS

Efforts toward inclusivity include ramps, lifts, wheelchairs, and special toilets for differently-abled students. A new air-conditioned auditorium with 60 seats has been established for seminars, training, and academic events. The library also extended its service hours until midnight, further enhancing accessibility.

## OUTREACH AND KNOWLEDGE SHARING

The Ganesh Shankar Vidyarthi Central Library launched its first biannual newsletter (Vol. 1, Issue 01, 2025), highlighting academic services, research tools, alumni placements, and student achievements. The newsletter serves as a participatory platform, encouraging contributions from the university community.

## **PLACEMENT CELL**

The continuous efforts of the University Placement Cell in providing students with the right blend of training, guidance, and industry exposure have ensured that CSJM University graduates are prepared for the evolving demands of the job market. This year witnessed not only an impressive rise in placement percentages but also improved median salary packages and a more diverse pool of recruiters.

- The university recorded over 1,020 campus selections alongside more than 4,150 offers through mega job fairs, underscoring its growing recognition among recruiters.
- There was an improvement in compensation trends, with the median salary package rising to Rs. 4 LPA from Rs. 3.75 and the highest package reaching Rs. 12.45 LPA
- Recruiter engagement reached new heights, with more than 140 placement drives conducted during the year.

Anuja) from UIET, School of Engineering and Technology, brought laurels to the University by winning the Smart India Hackathon 2024 Grand Finale in Hyderabad (10-12 December 2024). Tackling a real-world challenge on Data Download Duplication, they built an efficient solution that impressed the evaluators and earned them the winner's title along with a cash prize of ₹1,00,000.



Team Syntax Weavers showcased their cybersecurity skills at the Cyber Hackathon 2025 organized by C-DAC Patna and the EOU, Bihar Police (25-26 June 2025). With their innovative solution on secure document sharing using invisible watermarking and controlled printing, the team won third prize, earning a trophy, medals, and a cash award of ₹10,000.



#### PENTATHON 2025

At Pentathon 2025, a prestigious national-level cybersecurity competition organized by National Critical Information Infrastructure Protection Centre (NCIIPC), AICTE, and the Ministry of Innovation Cell (1-3 May 2025), CSJMU students showcased remarkable talent. Nav Srijan (B.Tech CSE-AI, 2nd Year) secured the 16th national rank, while Aman Singh (BCA, 2nd Year) achieved the 22nd rank, standing out among participants from across India.

among only five women researchers from India chosen for this distinguished opportunity.



# HOSTEL EVENTS AND AWARENESS INITIATIVES

The hostels of the University are more than residential spaces; they are dynamic centres that nurture learning, culture, discipline, and social responsibility. Throughout the academic session of 2024–25, the men's and women's hostels organized a diverse range of programs and initiatives that engaged students in meaningful ways. These included health awareness drives, cultural and religious celebrations, sports competitions, social responsibility initiatives, and discipline-building sessions.

#### **HEALTH AND SAFETY AWARENESS**

- A Cervical Cancer Awareness Program was organized in Tatya Tope Senate Hall, where senior dignitaries including addressed students on preventive healthcare.
- A Self-Defense Workshop for Women (18 January 2025), jointly organized by Axis Bank and CSJMU, empowered female students with self-defense techniques. DSP Vinod Kumar Yadav (U.P. Police) shared information on women's rights, helplines such as 1090, and government support systems for safety.



#### **CULTURAL AND RELIGIOUS CELEBRATIONS**

- On Basant Panchami, a Saraswati Puja was celebrated in Saraswati Girls' Hostel with the active participation of wardens and students.
- On Janmashtami, students established an idol of Lord Krishna in the hostel premises and celebrated the festival with devotion.
- During Navratri, a Dandiya Night was organized at the campus helipad. Senior Ayurvedacharya Dr. Vandana Pathak graced the event as Chief Guest. The program featured cultural performances and enthusiastic student participation.
- On Diwali, hostels promoted an eco-friendly celebration by encouraging students to light diyas instead of bursting firecrackers, thereby reducing environmental harm.

#### SPORTS AND CREATIVE COMPETITIONS

- An Inter-Hostel Sports Competition at the campus stadium witnessed active participation by both male and female hostel residents. Winners were honored with medals, trophies, and certificates.
- A Rangoli Competition at Saraswati Girls' Hostel provided a platform for students to express creativity through traditional art forms.

#### **DISCIPLINE AND AWARENESS INITIATIVES**

- Regular orientation meetings were conducted by wardens and the Dean of Student Welfare to remind residents about hostel rules, respectful behaviour, and maintaining a conducive learning environment. Students were encouraged to adopt values of punctuality, cooperation, and mutual respect.
- As part of Anti-Ragging Awareness, posters and circulars highlighting the Zero Tolerance Policy were displayed across hostels. Freshers were oriented on their rights, university support systems, and UGC guidelines against ragging. Wardens emphasized that ragging is a violation of human dignity and carries strict legal consequences.

#### **SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY INITIATIVES**

• Following the terrorist attack at Pahalgam, Kashmir, a Candle March was organized to pay homage to innocent victims. The march started from the helipad and concluded at the Saraswati Statue near the Administrative Building.





# **CENTRE FOR WELLBEING**

The Centre for Wellbeing at Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur, was inaugurated on January 30, 2025. The Chief Guest was Dr. Amaresh Shrivastava, Psychiatrist and Professor Emeritus, Western University, Canada.

The Centre, located in the School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences functions Monday to Saturday, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

#### **Vision and Processes**

The Centre was established to promote mental health and emotional resilience among students, faculty, and staff.

Each client undergoes a structured process involving consent, case history, clinical assessment, and personalized counselling. Based on severity, therapy sessions are scheduled, with referrals made to psychiatrists and family engagement encouraged where required.

The Centre follows strict ethical standards, ensuring informed consent, confidentiality, beneficence, and non-maleficence. Data is used only for official purposes, and confidentiality is lifted only in case of imminent risk.

#### The Centre delivers a wide spectrum of evidence-based therapies, including:

- CBT, Behavioural Activation, ACT, and Supportive Psychotherapy for mood disorders.
- Exposure Therapy, Relaxation Training, and Mindfulness for anxiety and panic.
- DBT and Schema Therapy for personality and identity concerns.
- Trauma-Focused CBT and Narrative Therapy for survivors of abuse and violence.
- Family Therapy, Couple Counselling, and IPT for relationship conflicts.
- Motivational Interviewing, NLP, and Assertiveness Training for personal development.

Beyond clinical concerns, the Centre addresses exam stress, internet addiction, peer pressure, anger, low confidence, sleep problems, and time management, ensuring a holistic approach to student wellness.

#### **Assessments and Internships**

The Centre provides standardized psychological assessments including cognitive and neuropsychological testing, personality measures, and diagnostic clarification, aiding in accurate treatment planning.

This year, six students of the Postgraduate Diploma in Guidance and Counselling successfully completed internships at the Centre. They gained exposure to clinical interviews, assessments, counselling, CBT, anger management, and career counselling, thus preparing them as future professionals in mental health.

# YOGA OPD

As part of the International Day of Yoga 2025 celebrations, the Yoga OPD was inaugurated on June 19, 2025 (Thursday) at Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur. The purpose of this OPD is to provide yoga therapy services to students, faculty members, officers, staff, as well as the general public. Various yoga practices such as asanas, pranayama, meditation, kriyas, and shatkarmas are used here to treat different ailments.

The Yoga OPD functions daily from 7:30 AM to 10:00 AM, offering yoga therapy services in both online and offline modes.

Depending on specific health conditions, one-month yoga therapy camps are organized using both online and offline methods. The diagnosis and sessions for patients coming to the OPD are conducted by Dr. Rajnikant Vishisht, Assistant Professor of Yoga, with active support from research scholars and postgraduate students of Yoga.



So far, nearly 100 patients have benefited from the yoga therapy services.

A dedicated YouTube channel, CSJMU YOGA OPD, has also been launched to promote yoga OPD activities. It features yoga instructional videos, practice modules, and learning resources for students and faculty.





# **HEALTH CENTRE**

The Health Centre of CSJMU has remained steadfast in its mission to provide accessible, preventive, and responsive healthcare to the university community throughout the academic year 2024–25. Over the year, the center delivered a wide range of medical, physiotherapy, and diagnostic services to students, staff, faculty and nearby community to more than 13, 800 patients.

In line with the Prime Minister's vision to eliminate tuberculosis well before 2030, and under the guidance of the Hon'ble Chancellor, the University undertook a major social responsibility initiative to support deprived communities through affordable healthcare and nutrition. The University adopted 100 TB patients, providing them with nutritional support and regular counselling.



Emphasizing the importance of preventive health, the University also organized multiple awareness and screening programs. A Cervical Cancer Vaccination Drive was conducted for students of Health Sciences, inspired by the Hon'ble Governor of Uttar Pradesh. Additionally, 153 girls from nearby community areas were successfully vaccinated, reflecting the University's commitment to both student welfare and community health.

The year also featured several special health initiatives aimed at community well-being. Voluntary blood donation camps were organized, encouraging students and staff to contribute towards life-saving transfusions. More than 200 units blood has been donated. Kidney screening camps were held for early detection of chronic kidney disease risk factors, ensuring timely referrals and lifestyle guidance. Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA) screening programs helped identify individuals with potential sleep-related breathing disorders, while anaemia screening drives targeted both students and staff to detect and manage iron


deficiency and related conditions. These targeted health screenings added a valuable preventive dimension to the center's services and strengthened the culture of proactive health management within the university. Several Swarnaprashan events were also organized to strengthen children's immunity, while awareness sessions on nutrition guided the university community towards healthier lifestyles.In addition to physical health initiatives, the




centre actively promoted wellness and mental well-being.

- On World Physiotherapy Day, educational sessions on posture and ergonomics were conducted. World Sight Day raised awareness about eyes and early screening.
- World Heart Day raised awareness about keeping the heart healthy through exercise, yoga and life style changes.
- Stress management sessions was organized regularly, alongside counselling services by trained psychologists for students facing academic or personal pressures.
- The University invested significantly in strengthening health infrastructure. A new X-ray unit was installed in 2024, improving diagnostic capabilities. Additionally, a 24-hour ambulance service was introduced, ensuring timely response in critical situations and extending the reach of medical care beyond the campus.
- One of the most transformative milestones this year was the digitization of healthcare delivery at the School of Health Sciences. In collaboration with Health Compass Pvt. Ltd., a DPIIT-recognized startup incubated at the CSJM Innovation Foundation, the University implemented a fully digital healthcare system powered by an indigenous Electronic Medical Records (EMR) platform.
- Within just four months, every step of the patient journey—from appointment booking and consultation to diagnostics, billing, and report delivery—was seamlessly integrated into a 100% paperless, cashless, and transparent digital ecosystem powered by our home grown Electronic Medical Records (EMR) platform.
- This initiative represents more than a technological upgrade—it marks a cultural shift towards data-driven, accessible, and patient-centric healthcare. CSJMU now stands as a national model for digital health innovation in higher education institutions.
- CSJMU's healthcare services are designed to be inclusive and affordable, ensuring that economically deprived and underprivileged patients receive quality care at minimal cost.

For students of health sciences, these services provide invaluable clinical exposure. Both undergraduate and postgraduate students are trained through rotations in OPDs and affiliated hospitals, with new partnerships established in 2025, including with Amrita School for Special Children. The OPDs now cater to patients across all age groups—from paediatric geriatric—aligning with the University's vision of "adding years to life and life to years."








#### **MILESTONES**

Between 1st July 2024 and 31st July 2025, C.S.J.M. University provided health services to patients amounting to ₹13,09,576 (Thirteen Lakhs Nine Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Six only). For comparable services at commercial/market rates, the cost would have been approximately ₹41,81,498.40 (Forty-One Lakhs Eighty-One Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-Eight and Forty Paise only). Thus, patients availed a net benefit of ₹28,71,922.40 (Twenty-Eight Lakhs Seventy-One Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-Two and Forty Paise only) through the university's healthcare facilities.

# NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC) ACTIVITIES

The NCC Unit of CSJM University has played a vital role in nurturing leadership qualities, discipline, and national pride among students during 2024–25. Through training, participation in camps, community outreach, and representation at national platforms, the cadets have upheld the values of service, unity, and integrity, thereby enhancing the University's contribution to nation-building.

- Enrolment: The unit enrolled a total of 87 cadets 49 boys and 38 girls
- Participation in Camps: Cadets University participated in a range of training camps organized at different levels.
  - (a) Combined Annual Training Camps (CATC): 57 cadets
  - (b) Republic Day Camp (RDC): 11 cadets
  - (c) Vayu Sainik Camp (VSC): 15 cadets
- Awards and Recognitions: The cadets of the unit brought laurels to the University by achieving distinctions at prestigious platforms:
  - (a) Cadet Shilendra Singh was selected for the Republic Day Camp, New Delhi.
- (b)CWO Raju Ranjan Yadav and CWO Mani Shukla were awarded the Best Cadet title at the Inter Group Competition (IGC)
- Social and Outreach Activities: The unit demonstrated social commitment by organizing and participating in several community service programs:
- a) Cleanliness drives under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.
- b) Blood Donation Camps, where three cadets each from the School of Health Sciences and the 03 UP Air Squadron donated blood.

# NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) ACTIVITIES

# NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS) ACTIVITIES

#### **UNITS & ENROLMENT**

At present, 67 NSS units are functioning under CSJMU, including 6 units within the University campus and 61 units in affiliated colleges. Nearly 6,700 student volunteers are actively associated with the scheme, and as per government directives, each unit has adopted a village or locality to carry out community service.

#### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

During the year, 46 units organized one-day and seven-day special camps in their adopted villages/localities, with about 2,200 volunteers participating in community service. Medical camps were also organized in these villages with the help of qualified doctors. From 17 September to 2 October 2024, volunteers from all units served daily in 46 government hospitals, where groups of five volunteers assisted patients. In addition, under the Filaria Eradication Program, nearly 3,250 individuals were given the required dosage through community health centres.

#### NATIONAL & SOCIAL PROGRAMS

The NSS successfully implemented several programs of national importance in accordance with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, including the National Youth Parliament, Meri Maati Mera Desh, Amrit Kalash Yatra, My Bharat Wali Diwali, and the Women Empowerment Campaign.

#### **RECOGNITION & DIGITAL INITIATIVES**

Through dynamic leadership, effective implementation, and digital reporting, the University's NSS Cell earned special recognition among all NSS cells in Uttar Pradesh and received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. The Mahatma Gandhi Seva League Online Portal was launched on 2 October 2023, under which activities such as "From Beggary to Scholarship" and "Personal Cleanliness to Social Cleanliness" are being carried out and uploaded by each unit. In addition, the Ministry has made it mandatory for all units to upload their activities on the My Bharat Portal.

#### SPECIAL OBSERVANCES

On International Yoga Day (21 June 2024), yoga practice sessions were organized in adopted villages with the participation of around 2,100 volunteers. A one-day orientation training program for NSS Programme Officers was also conducted.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS & PARTICIPATION**

Five volunteers represented CSJMU at the Republic Day Parade Camp 2024 in Ranchi, and one volunteer participated in the Republic Day Parade Camp in New Delhi in January 2025. Another volunteer took part in the Independence Day Parade 2025 at the Red Fort, New Delhi. Volunteers also participated in the National Integration Camp at Bareilly and in camps held at Jaipur and Bhubaneswar. In addition, NSS Programme Officers represented Uttar Pradesh as contingent leaders at regional directorate-level programs.

#### YOUTH PARLIAMENT

The University organized a Youth Parliament in which 10 volunteers were selected to participate at the state level. Two volunteers secured second and third positions in the competition, and following the screening, Ms. Vaishnavi Gupta and Ms. Anushka Shukla were chosen to represent the University at the National Youth Parliament in New Delhi, bringing laurels to CSJMU.

#### **AWARDS & HONOURS**

To encourage and recognize their contributions, awards and certificates of appreciation were distributed periodically to volunteers and Programme Officers. Each year, four volunteers receive the Karmveer Award, three Programme Officers are honoured with the Ganesh Shankar Vidyarthi Award, and the best-performing NSS units are felicitated with the Swami Vivekananda Award during the University's Foundation Day celebrations.





## **MUKHYAMANTRI ABHYUDAY SCHEME**

The Mukhyamantri Abhyuday Scheme is a flagship initiative by the Uttar Pradesh government to offer free coaching for students preparing for major competitive examinations, aiming to support meritorious yet economically disadvantaged youth across the state. The scheme includes online and offline classes, expert guidance, study materials, webinars, and modern infrastructure such as smart classrooms and e-learning platforms.

The University has established modern infrastructure with smart classrooms and elearning platforms to provide free coaching for competitive exams such as UPSC, UPPSC, SSC, NEET, JEE, NDA, and others. The initiative ensures equitable opportunities for students from rural and economically weaker backgrounds by blending traditional and digital learning. Guidance is offered by senior officers and subject experts, along with career counseling, doubt-solving sessions, and access to quality study resources. Selection is merit-based through aptitude tests, fostering an inclusive, merit-driven learning environment that empowers students to compete confidently at national and state levels.


#### **CLASSES FOR NTA-NET**

The Department of Education, CSJMU, Kanpur initiated NTA-NET (Education) preparation classes under the Mukhyamantri Abhyuday Yojana to support research scholars and postgraduate students. A One-Day Orientation Programme was held on 7 April 2025, providing motivation and mentorship from eminent academicians. A total of 40 candidates registered, of which 4 qualified for JRF (10%) and 11 for NET (27.5%), marking an overall success rate of 37.5%. This outcome highlights the scheme's effectiveness in enhancing academic competitiveness and research potential.

Summary of Registrations & Results

#### **CLASSES FOR UPPCS**

In 2024–25, 106 students enrolled in UPSC/UPPCS coaching at CSJMU, with 2 qualifying UPPCS (Prelims) and 1 clearing the UP Police Exam. Motivational sessions by IAS/IPS/PCS officers, printed study material, regular tests, and personalized mentoring ensured quality preparation. Under the Abhyuday Yojana, teachers are selected annually through a rigorous process, and for 2025–26, 16 subject experts were appointed. In the current session, 122 students have enrolled, with daily classes conducted in two batches. The program is closely monitored through



surprise inspections by District Social Welfare Officer and Deputy Director, Social Welfare, Kanpur Division, Kanpur Nagar ensuring effective implementation.



# **ALUMNI CELL**

The Alumni Cell of the University actively engaged in a series of initiatives during the academic year 2024–25 to strengthen the bond between the university and its alumni network. 
# PROJECT MONITORING UNIT (PMU)

The Project Monitoring Unit (PMU) has been established to cater to all application software requirements of the University. Through in-house software development, the PMU has enabled timely project execution, enhanced productivity, and significant cost savings. At present, the PMU is entrusted with the implementation and management of various modules of the Samarth Portal, particularly those related to Academics and the Student Lifecycle.

#### SAMARTH AT CSJMU

The Samarth Portal is an e-governance platform developed by the Government of India to support universities and higher education institutions in digitizing their processes. The University has successfully implemented several important academic and administrative functions under the Samarth Portal.

- Through the Samarth Portal, the admission process for both 2024–25 and 2025–26 sessions was successfully managed. This has made the entire admission system more organized and transparent for students.
- Examinations for the 2024–25 session were also conducted through the portal, and the results were declared online, ensuring a smooth and efficient process for both students and the university.
- Using the portal, students of the 2024–25 session were able to apply for and receive Migration Certificates and Provisional Certificates in a hassle-free manner. By integrating these services into Samarth, students no longer need to face manual delays and can access these documents easily.
- One of the key developments has been the introduction of facilities for Marksheet Printing, Secret Chart Printing, and Bulk Degree Printing. These services have added great value, making academic document management faster and more reliable.
- The LMS (Learning Management System) module of Samarth has been actively utilized to launch three vocational courses — Cyber Security, AI for AII, and Financial Literacy. Students are now able to learn these new-age skills directly through the portal, which enhances their academic as well as professional development.
- The portal has also been used for Attendance Monitoring of campus students, which has helped in maintaining academic discipline and ensuring better engagement in classrooms.






# STUDENT SUPPORT CELL

## STUDENT SUPPORT CELL

The Student Support Cell was established in 2021 to bring all student-related services under one umbrella through a unified online portal. It provides a wide range of essential student services through online mode in alignment with the Digital India Program of the Govt of India and services mandated by the Higher Education Department under the Janhit Guarantee Adhiniyam. These include issuance of degrees, duplicate and corrected marksheets/certificates, disposal of examination results (Incomplete/RD/Absent/UFM/CO/BP/BPRD), digitally signed certificates, enrollment and migration services, transcripts, provisional certificates, and educational document verification.

The SSC operates through two dedicated portals—Faceless Student Services and the Educational Document Verification Portal—both developed by the University Project Monitoring Unit (PMU) as part of the ERP system. The SSC and PMU teams work in close coordination to regularly update and upgrade these portals, ensuring they remain responsive to user needs and increasingly student- and staff-friendly.

- Digitisation of correction orders is continuously being done, and 34,000+ orders have been scanned from 2021 onwards.
- Data of any student can be checked and verified instantaneously from Faceless Student Services portal and DMS to deliver various services (Degree/ Provisional/ Single Subject Certificate/ Marksheet/ Enrollment/ Migration/ Transcript/ Education Document Verification).

# **ESTATE OFFICE**

The Estate Office has continued to play a vital role in shaping and maintaining the physical and environmental infrastructure of the University. Working diligently behind the scenes, the office has transformed plans into tangible facilities while ensuring that the campus remains safe, welcoming, and sustainable for students, faculty, and visitors alike.

- Building and Renewing Spaces: The year witnessed the foundation stone laying of several key projects, including the installation of a modern fire-fighting system, high mast lighting for campus safety, and major extensions to the MSW Building (third floor), Swarn Jayanti Hostel, AB Building, and ECE Building. Internal roads were repaired and widened for better accessibility, while Type-4A residences underwent significant renovation
- Several projects reached completion and were inaugurated, including the renovated
  Type-I Colony and Campus School, the newly constructed Journalism Building, and
  upgraded sports facilities with a running track, multipurpose court, and dedicated
  basketball and volleyball courts.
- Day-to-Day Care and Maintenance: Supported by a skilled team of engineers, electricians, plumbers, carpenters, RO technicians, welders, and AC specialists, the Estate Office ensured that essential services were delivered promptly and efficiently, thereby maintaining the smooth functioning of the University.
- Upgrading Existing Facilities: Improvements extended to existing infrastructure with the addition of solar panels, replacement of old wiring with energy-efficient copper systems, and the implementation of rainwater harvesting. Automated systems for water supply management and regular sanitation checks in academic blocks and hostels reinforced the commitment to health and efficiency.
- Collaborative Efforts: Progress was facilitated by partnerships with agencies such as HBTU (technical checks), Nagar Nigam (sanitation and waste management), KESCO (power supply), and construction and development agencies including UPRNN, UPPCL, UPRNSS, SIDCO, and UPAVP. These collaborations ensured adherence to the highest standards of quality and safety.
- Future Plans: Plans for the coming year include the construction of a new boys' hostel and a new girls' hostel to meet growing residential needs. Additionally, the installation of an LED outdoor video wall and a 55-inch movable display is planned to enhance information-sharing and campus events.
- A Greener, Cleaner Campus: Several measures were under keeping sustainability in mind such as the introduction of electric carts and eco-friendly vehicles, a ban on single-use plastics, installation of solar power systems, LED lighting, and BLDC fans across multiple buildings. The Miyawaki forest project is steadily expanding campus greenery, while Chandan Garden continues to thrive as a space of biodiversity and natural beauty.

# **ESTABLISHMENT OF A MIYAWAKI FOREST**

At Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Vinay Kumar Pathak initiated a massive tree plantation campaign along with the establishment of a Miyawaki Forest on the campus. On this occasion, the Registrar, Assistant Registrar, Deans, Directors, Coordinators, faculty members, and students planted saplings of Arjun, Drumstick, Sheesham, Tamarind, Peepal, Banyan, Teak, Jungle Jalebi, Neem, Gulmohar, Amaltas, and others under the government's theme "Ek Ped – Maa Ke Naam" (One Tree in the Name of Mother).

All Heads of Departments coordinated with teachers and staff members actively participated in making this large-scale plantation campaign successful. The objective is to honor mothers by encouraging plantation in their names and to link environmental conservation with a tribute to motherhood, which symbolizes that mothers, like trees, nurture and protect life. This is an afforestation technique developed by Japanese botanist Akira Miyawaki, through which dense, native forests can be grown in a short time.

# **ESTABLISHMENT OF SANDALWOOD GROVE**

A Sandalwood Grove was established in the campus of Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur (School of Advanced Agricultural Sciences and Technology) in collaboration with the Subhashini Shivhare Foundation.

In the programme organized on the theme "Sandalwood Grove and Pond: Rest in the Lap of Nature", the Chief Guest was senior Ayurvedacharya Dr. Vandana Pathak, along with the Hon'ble Pro-Vice Chancellor Prof. Sudhir Kumar Awasthi, Subhashini Shivhare, and Praveen Bhai Patel.

This Sandalwood Grove is located near the Amrit Sarovar situated within the university campus.

A total of 50 sandalwood saplings

were planted, comprising 25 white sandalwood and 25 red sandalwood plants.

In her address, senior Ayurvedacharya Mrs. Vandana Pathak stated that the medicinal properties present in sandalwood serve as a popular remedy for skin diseases, fever, and various other ailments.

The Dada Saheb Phalke Studio Production Centre, established in the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication in 2021–22, has developed into a premier media hub of the University.
