A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Objective: To promote social and cultural cooperation and exchange in the field of social work.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BY AND BETWEEN

AND

CHHATRAPATI SHAHU JI MAHARAJ UNIVERSITY, KANPUR (U.P.)

Preamble:

Whereas, Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur (CSJMU), established in 1966, has been on the map of higher education for more than five decades. It has over 700 affiliated colleges in several districts. Spreadingover acampus of 264 acres, the university is booming with academic activities. While the undergraduate and post-graduate programmes in all disciplines of Art, Science, Commerce, Law, Engineering, Management, Pharmacy and Health Sciences. The residential wing of the University has ten schools of studies viz. Engineering and Technology; Sciences; Management and Information Sciences; Creative and Performing Arts; Health Sciences; Pharmaceutical Sciences; Pharmaceutical Sciences; Languages; Legal Studies; Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences; Teacher Education. It also has DeenDayalShodh Kendra and a College Development Council. For catering to the needs of young engineering aspirants, the university runs an Institute of Engineering and Technology in the campus offering courses in four branches of engineering viz. Computer Science, Information Technology, Mechanical Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Materials Science and Metallurgical Engineering, Electronics and Communication, Fashion Technology, Interior Design, Bioinformatics, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics. The university seeks to contribute to student an education through curriculum design, the development of new courses and the application of a forward looking and innovative teaching methodology. Kanpur, the industrial capital of U.P. and commonly known as the Manchester of Northern India has had a very eventful history. It has contributed much to the growth and economic development of the country. Equally memorable and inspiring is its role in the first Indian War of Independence. The Institute of Biosciences and Biotechnology consists of six Departments: Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Environmental Science, Food Technology, Nutrition Science, and Microbiology. The Institute was established The year 2001 to provide higher education and facilitate research in the emerging biological areas and offer courses at UG, PG and PhD levels. Over the years, the Department of Life Sciences & Biotechnology and Pharmaceutical Sciences havereceived funding from State and Central Funding agencies such as UGC, CSIR, DST, DBT, DAE, DST(UP) and RUSA grant for carrying out research as well as development of teaching and laboratory infrastructure. The major thrust areas of research in the university include technological domains

like chemical engineering, computer science and information, mechanical engineering, electronics &communication, artificial intelligence and machine learning. Basic and applied research areas include ethnopharmacology, natural product, phytochemistry, plant physiology and enzyme technology, diabetes and rheumatoid arthritis, fish biology, genetics, molecular & cell biology, cell signaling, cancer biology &therapy, and drug development& novel drug delivery systems. The Central Instrumentation Facility was established recently to promote science and research activities in different departments of the University as well as its affiliated colleges. It provides facilities for users under one roof for researches applying tools and techniques in protein and nucleic acid separation & detection, analytical and biochemical techniques, microbial and animal cell cultures, PCR and RT-PCR, various microscopy and spectroscopy techniques. The University also has Institutional Animal Ethical Review Board and animal research facility.

Whereas, Shree Sai Naina Foundation, Kanpur, established on 16.11.2018 provides education, music & dance therapy classes, craft making skills and vocational training to special children so that these children can be a part of mainstream society and also be financially independent in their lives. Several programs conducted in this area by the organization are Deepti Sharma Show in which special children performed a musical program; non- fire cooking, Junior Chef; awareness program entitled, "Aao Chale Prakriti ki Ore"; tree plantation drive; seller exhibition displaying the handicrafts of special children; Breast Cancer Awareness program (joint activity with Rotary Club, Kanpur); Health Club (joint activity with Loins Club International, Kanpur); online programs (Muskuraye Kanpur Forum) conducted during COVID pandemic; and mask making contest etc.

The organization has been awarded by Hon. Governor of U.P., (Shrimati) Anandiben Patel and Hon. Dy. Chief Minister, Mr. Keshav Prasad Maurya for its unique social efforts and activities. The organization has also won several state level awards for its endeavors with special children.

The Founder President is also associated with Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas, New Delhi as CoCoordinator and is involved in several activities pertaining to environmental protection.

Whereas, it is highly desirable to develop multi-disciplinary training and joint social activities through involvement and integration of diverse but relevant disciplines through synergy and knowledge sharing, and ensure dissemination of knowledge to all corners of the country.

Both parties felt that a sustained, synergetic and effective collaboration between **Shree Sai Naina Foundation**, **Kanpur** and the Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University, Kanpur will enhance the strength, and add value to, the efforts of each party.

The Parties therefore agree on the aims of creating an institutional

framework for enriching socio-cultural endeavors in mutually agreed fields of teaching and training with this memorandum of understanding (MoU), to facilitate a formal tie-up for developing a spirit of academic and social cooperation with each other.

- 1. This agreement aims to promote academic, social and cultural cooperation and exchange of teaching and research experiences between **Shree Sai Naina Foundation**, **Kanpur** (henceforth referred to as **SSNF**) and the Chhatrapati Shahu Ji Maharaj University (henceforth referred to as CSJMU).
- 2. The two organizations shall cooperate in developing mutual interests on a reciprocal basis and respect for the independence and equal status of each organization.

3. Scope of MOU

This agreement details the terms & conditions, financial arrangements and modalities of collaboration that may involve intellectual property rights (IPR), and responsibilities and obligations of the **SSNF** and CSJMU, pertaining to the

- (i) Training/projects undertaken by the members of SSNF,
- (ii) Joint social and cultural activities

4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF CSJMU& SSNF

- > CSJMU will allow members of the **SSNF** to visit its institutes/faculties from time to time with mutual consent and after due correspondence and permission from both the institutes.
- With mutual consent and prior permission from and/or between the concerned institutes, members of the **SSNF** may be allowed to do projects and short-term courses, internship programs.
- > CSJMU may formally depute its faculty-members, whenever possible, to arrange social and cultural activities for **SSNF** special children.
- > CSJMU may organize seminar, workshop or conference at its campus. In such cases the **CSJMU** will provide all the logistic support to the **SSNF**.
 - Any other academic, social and cultural activities may be jointly organized by the CSJMU & **SSNF** like co-hosting of workshops, seminars etc., after due consultation, assessment and mutual consent.
- After prior approval from the respective authorities, the members of **SSNF** may be permitted to do project works with CSJMU faculties at CSJMU. In such cases the incidental cost of transport etc. of the **SSNF** memebers shall be borne by the **SSNF**.

5. General Agreements

The two parties/organizations agree to:

- a. Exchange academic materials and information;
- b. Visit of members, if possible;



- c. Hold joint awareness programs, national conferences, training, workshops, seminars etc.;
- d. Sharing of infrastructure facilities of CSJMU like Auditorium, seminar halls, multipurpose halls, lawns etc for joint programs.
- e. Support of faculty from Music Department, Fine Arts and Performing Arts, Social Works Department, Health sciences and Psychology etc.
- f. Conduct joint research project and apply for funding;
- g. Engage in the activities for better mutually understanding and cooperation;
- h. Support to SSNF by involving students and NSS from CSIMU

6. FORCEMAJEURE

Neither the SSNF nor CSJMU shall be held responsible for non-fulfillment of their respective obligations under this agreement, due to the exigency of one or more of the force majeure events such as but not limited to acts of God, war, flood, earthquakes, strikes, lockouts, epidemics, riots, civil commotions etc., provided on the occurrence and cessation of any such event the parties affected thereby, shall give a notice in writing to the other party within one month of such occurrence or cessation. If the forcemajeure continues beyond six months, the parties shall jointly decide about the future course of action.

7. TERMIANTION OF AGREEMENT

This agreement may be terminated by either of the parties forth with if either of them commits breach of any of the terms here of and shall have failed to rectify such breach within thirty days of the notice in this behalf having been served on it by the other party i.e., either SSNF or CSJMU in correspondence; as the case may be. In addition to the above reasons, this agreement may be terminated forth with if either of the parties voluntarily or involuntarily enters into official dilution, bankruptcy or similar recognizable proceedings or if, applications invoking such proceedings have been filed.

8. DURATION

This 'Memorandum of Understanding' shall remain valid for a period of five years from the date of signing of the MoU. After this, the MoU may be terminated or may be renewed after judging the then situation.

9. SETTLEMENTS

Upon termination of the agreement: All rights granted to CSJMU and The SSNF hereto, shall cease to exist forth with; except the obligation of The SSNF to keep collaborative activity in confidence, accrued on or prior to the date of such termination, make written reports and keep records, files and books, and the right of CSJMU to inspect the same.

10. AMENDMENTS TO THE AGREEMENT

No amendment or modification of this MOU shall be valid unless the same made in writing by either the parties or their authorized representatives, specifically stating the amendment to this MOU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are executed; unless otherwise agreed to. In general, the MOU will be amended on yearly basis, IF AT ALL REQUIRED, on mutually agreed terms.

11. ASSIGNMENT OF THE AGREEMENT

The rights and/or liabilities of this MOU shall not be assigned except with the written consent of The SSNF and CSJMU, subject to such terms and conditions, as may be mutually agreed upon, by both the parties

12. The details of this agreement are to be decided by mutual consultation between the two parties. Both parties understand that all terms and conditions of the abovementioned activities as well as financial arrangements will have to be negotiated and established in separate written agreements.

13. This agreement is executed in English in two original copies and each party will retain one original copy.
