The committee discussed the following points:

- 1. Revision/Updation of the various courses offered by the dept. of HSS
- 2. The viability of offering the course HSS-S 503 as an open elective for all the branches of B.Tech programme.
- 3. To change the name of the course if required.

Recommendations for HSS-S 101(Professional Communication)

The syllabus of HSS 101 was thoroughly discussed. The committee decided that the syllabus of UPTU will be followed for the above course and emphasised that the content of this course will be taught in three lectures per week.

Recommendations for HSS-S 301(Communication and Presentation Skills)

The syllabus of HSS 301 was updated and few changes were incorporated. The last unit "Literary Concepts" was felt irrelevant for engineering students and hence was removed from the syllabus. The topic of 'Listening skills' was added in second Unit. The name of the course was suggested by the expert as "Communication Practicum". Committee emphasised that for a lab course at least two hours of seminar and presentations by each student is essential.

Recommendations for HSS-S 401(Industrial Economics)

The committee extensively discussed the existing syllabus for HSS-S401 and came up with a more detailed course structure with a few valuable recommendations which have been duly incorporated in the revised syllabus.

- Monopolistic market (from unit-3) was considered irrelevant and hence was removed from the syllabus
- 2. Concepts of time value of money and capital budgeting have been included in unit-5
- 3. Keeping in view the changes occurred in the existing tax structure in India, the committee included GST in unit-6. It will replace the existing topic Indian Tax system.
- 4. Looking at the contents of the revised syllabus and its relevance to the B.Tech programme, the committee aptly renamed the course as 'Engineering Economics'

Recommendations for HSS-S503 (Indian Economic Problems and Policies)

The committee decided that HSS-S503 must be offered as an open elective by the dept. of HSS, for all the branches of B.Tech programme of UIET. Committee emphasised that for the above course, seminar and presentation by the students is very important and should be a part of the course.

Recommendations for HSS-S 201(Industrial Management)

The committee included the following topics in the existing syllabus.

- 1. Contribution of Mayo, Drucker, Centralisation-Decentralisation in Unit-2
- 2. Personality, Group dynamics in Unit-5
- 3. Conflict Management has been deleted from the syllabus.
